


## **General Description**

This N-Channel SyncFET<sup>TM</sup> is produced using Fairchild Semiconductor's advanced PowerTrench<sup>®</sup> process. Advancements in both silicon and package technologies have been combined to offer the lowest r<sub>DS(on)</sub> while maintaining excellent switching performance by extremely low Junction-to-Ambient thermal resistance. This device has the added benefit of an efficient monolithic Schottky body diode.






Figure 1. On Region Characteristics




Figure 3. Normalized On Resistance vs Junction Temperature




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 9. Unclamped Inductive Switching Capability




Figure 11. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage




Figure 10. Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs Ambient Temperature




Figure 12. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation





Figure 13. Junction-to-Ambient Transient Thermal Response Curve

# SyncFET<sup>TM</sup> Schottky body diode Characteristics


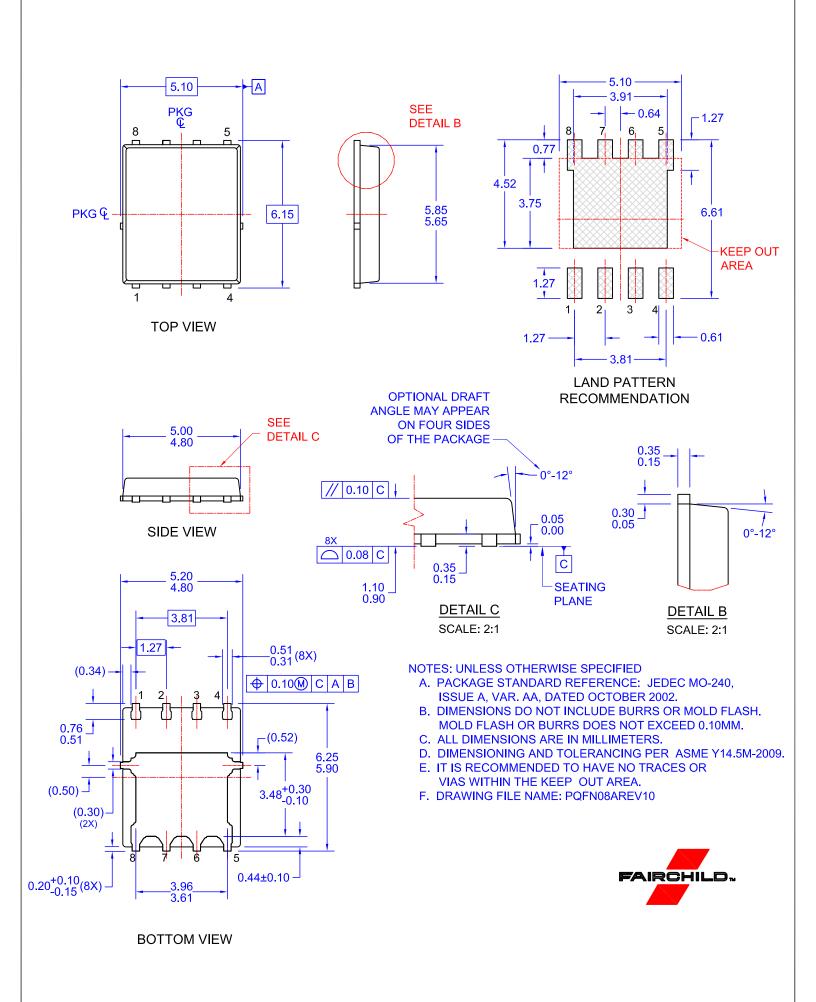


Figure 14. FDMS8558S SyncFET<sup>TM</sup> body diode reverse recovery characteristic

Fairchild's SyncFET<sup>TM</sup> process embeds a Schottky diode in parallel with PowerTrench MOSFET. This diode exhibits similar characteristics to a discrete external Schottky diode in parallel with a MOSFET. Figure 14 shows the reverse recovery characteristic of the FDMS8558S.

Schottky barrier diodes exhibit significant leakage at high temperature and high reverse voltage. This will increase the power in the device.
