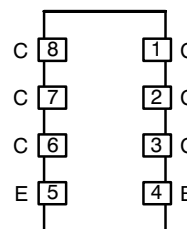

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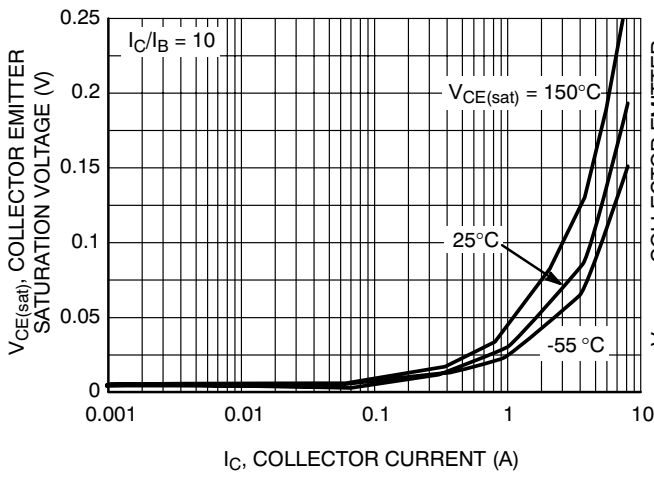


Figure 1. Collector Emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Collector Current

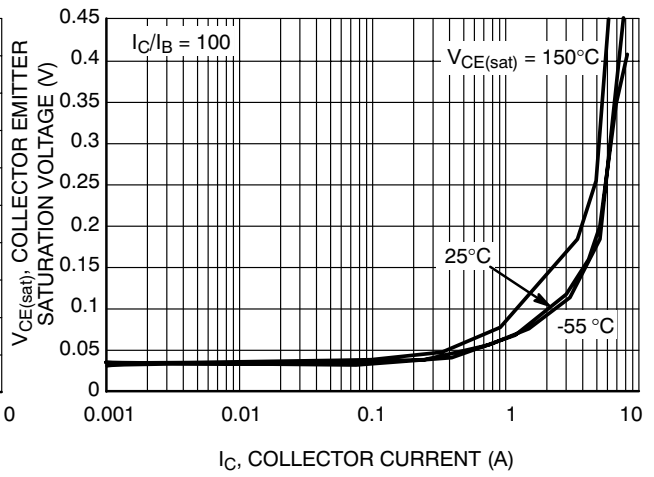


Figure 2. Collector Emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Collector Current

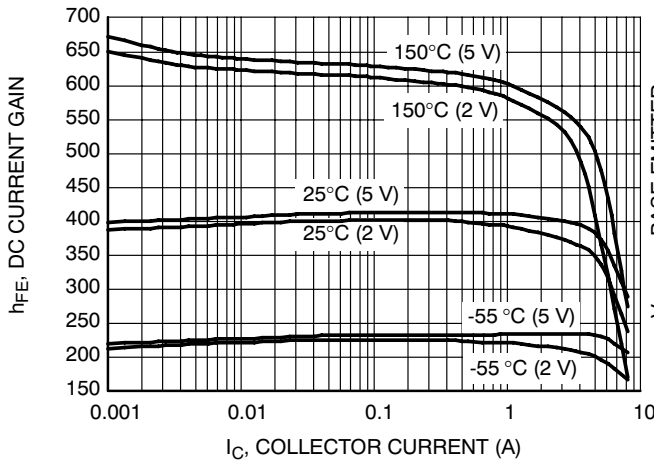


Figure 3. DC Current Gain vs. Collector Current

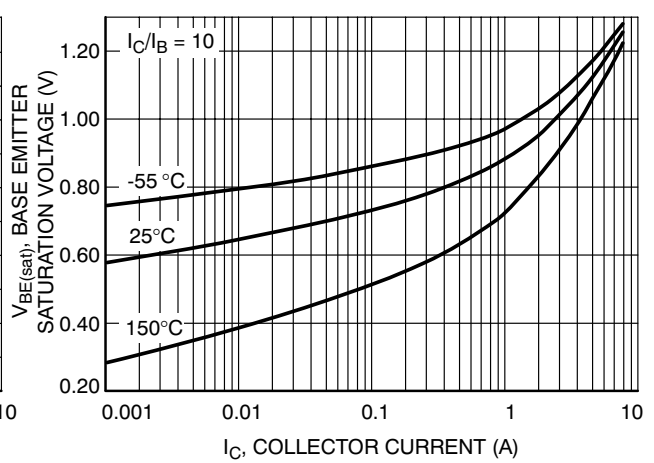


Figure 4. Base Emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Collector Current

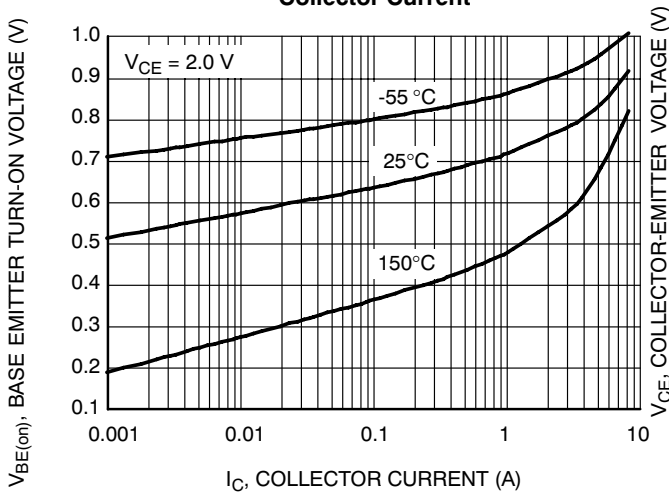


Figure 5. Base Emitter Turn-On Voltage vs. Collector Current

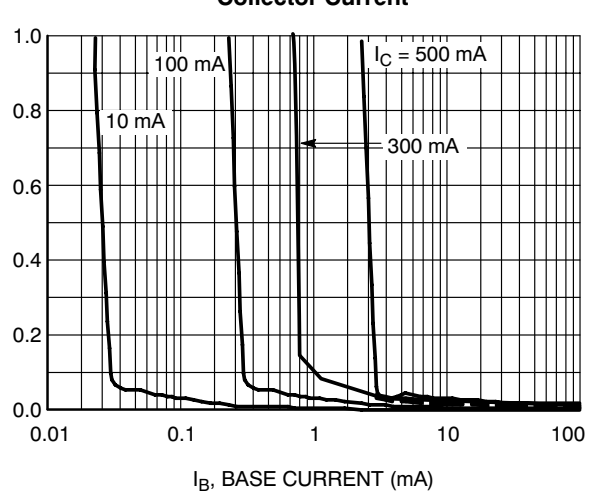


Figure 6. Saturation Region

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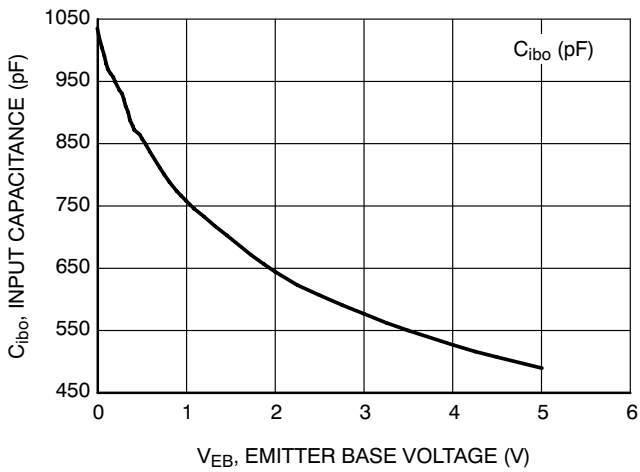


Figure 7. Input Capacitance

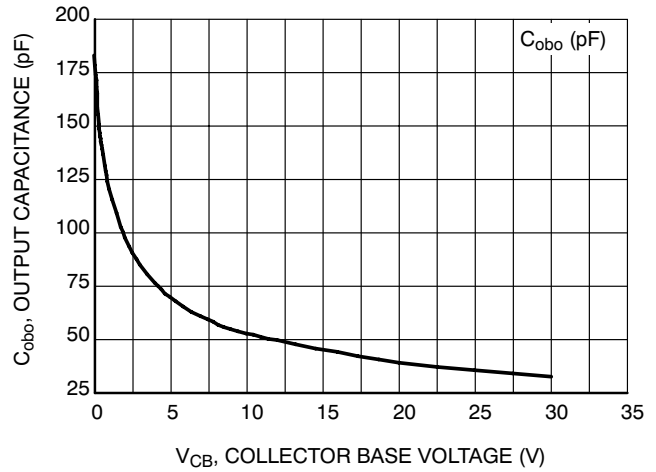


Figure 8. Output Capacitance

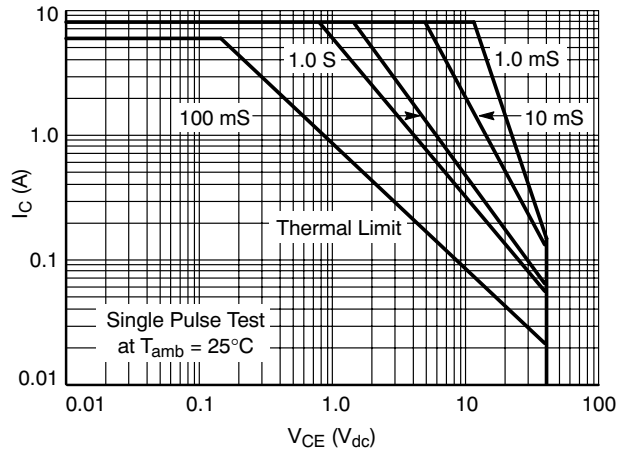
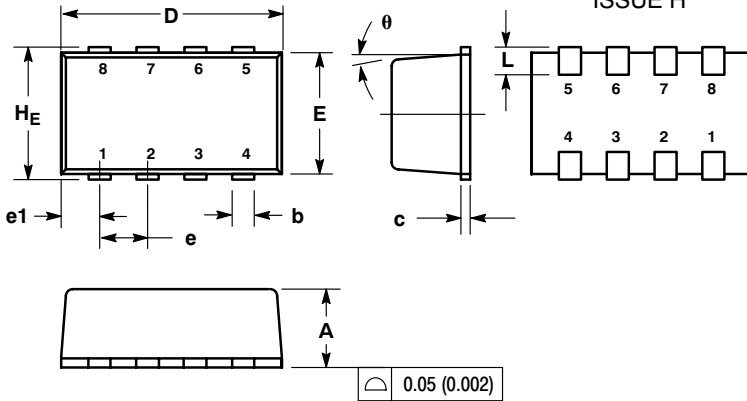


Figure 9. Safe Operating Area

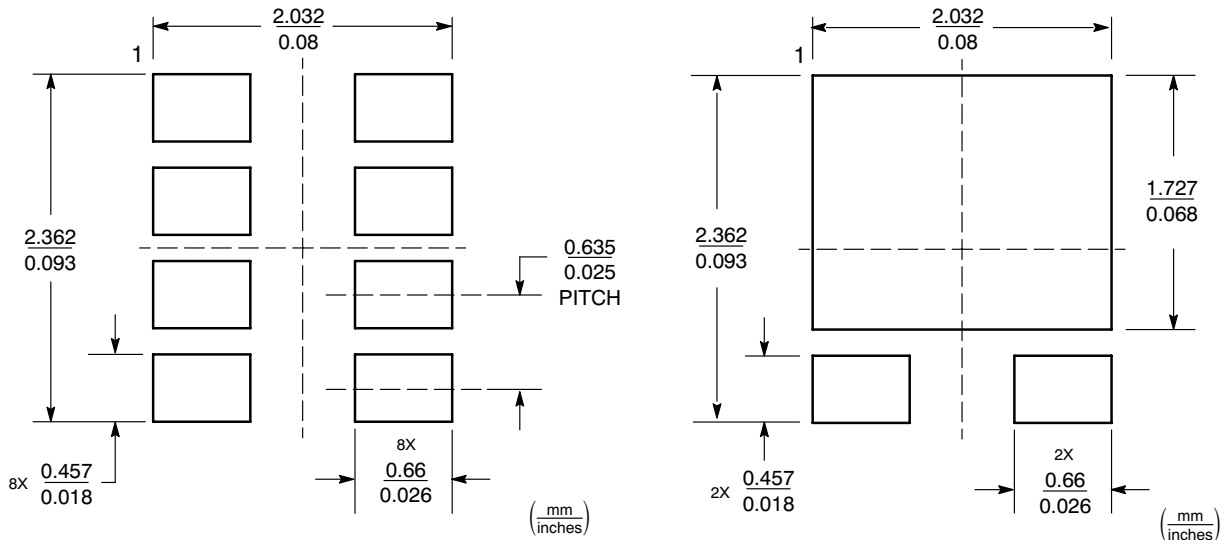
