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## Fault-Protected, High-Voltage Single 8-to-1/ Dual 4-to-1 Multiplexers with Output Clamps

### General Description

The MAX4508/MAX4509 are 8-to-1 and dual 4-to-1 fault-protected multiplexers that are pin compatible with the industry-standard DG508/DG509. The MAX4508/MAX4509 operate with dual supplies of  $\pm 4.5V$  to  $\pm 20V$  or a single supply of  $+9V$  to  $+36V$ . These multiplexers feature fault-protected inputs, rail-to-rail signal handling capability, and overvoltage clamping at 150mV beyond the rails.

Both parts offer  $\pm 40V$  overvoltage protection with supplies off and  $\pm 25V$  protection with supplies on. On-resistance is  $400\Omega$  max and is matched between channels to  $15\Omega$  max. All digital inputs have TTL logic thresholds, ensuring both TTL and CMOS logic compatibility when using a single  $+12V$  supply or dual  $\pm 15V$  supplies.



### **Detailed Description**

Traditional fault-protected multiplexers are constructed with three series FET switches. This produces good off protection, but limits the switches input voltage range to as much as 3V below the supply rails, reducing its usable dynamic range. As the voltage on one side of the switch approaches within about 3V of either supply rail (a fault condition), the switch impedance increases, limiting the output signal range to approximately 3V less than the appropriate polarity supply voltage.

The MAX4508/MAX4509 differ considerably from traditional fault-protected multiplexers, offering several advantages. First, they are constructed with two parallel FETs, allowing very low resistance when the switch is on. Second, they allow signals on the NO<sub>—</sub> pins that are within or beyond the supply rails to be passed through the switch to the COM terminal. This allows rail-to-rail signal operation. Third, when a signal V<sub>NO<sub>—</sub></sub> exceeds the supply rails (i.e., a fault condition), the voltage on COM<sub>—</sub> is limited to the supply rails. Operation is identical for both fault polarities.




Figure 1. Functional Diagram

When the NO<sub>\_</sub> voltage goes beyond supply rails (fault condition), the NO<sub>\_</sub> input becomes high impedance regardless of the switch state or load resistance. When power is removed, and the fault protection is still in effect, the NO<sub>\_</sub> terminals are a virtual open circuit. The fault can be up to  $\pm 40V$ , with V<sub>+</sub> = V<sub>-</sub> = 0. If the switch is on, the COM<sub>\_</sub> output current is furnished from the V<sub>+</sub> or V<sub>-</sub> pin by "booster" FETs connected to each supply pin. These FETs can source or sink up to 10mA.

The COM<sub>\_</sub> pins are not fault protected. If a voltage source is connected to any COM<sub>\_</sub> pin, it should be limited to the supply voltages. Exceeding the supply voltage will cause high currents to flow through the ESD protection diodes, damaging the device (see *Absolute Maximum Ratings*).

Figure 1 shows the internal construction, with the analog signal paths shown in bold. A single normally open (NO) switch is shown. The analog switch is formed by the parallel combination of N-channel FET N1 and P-channel FET P1, which are driven on and off simultaneously, according to the input fault condition and the logic level state.

### **NO<sub>\_</sub> Input Voltage**

The maximum allowable input voltage for safe operation depends on whether supplies are on or off and the load configuration at the COM output. If COM is referred to a voltage other than ground, but within the supplies, V<sub>NO<sub>\_</sub></sub> may range higher or lower than the supplies provided the absolute value of |V<sub>NO<sub>\_</sub></sub> - V<sub>COM</sub>| is less than 40V. For example, if the load is referred to +10V at COM<sub>\_</sub>, then the NO<sub>\_</sub> voltage range can be from +50V to -30V. As another example, if the load is connected to -10V at COM<sub>\_</sub>, the NO<sub>\_</sub> voltage range is limited to -50V to +30V.

If the supplies are  $\pm 15V$  and COM is referenced to ground through a load, the maximum NO<sub>\_</sub> voltage is  $\pm 25V$ . If the supplies are off and the COM output is referenced to ground, the maximum NO<sub>\_</sub> voltage is  $\pm 40V$ .

### **Normal Operation**

Two comparators continuously compare the voltage on the NO<sub>\_</sub> pin with V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub> supply voltages. When the signal on NO<sub>\_</sub> is between V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub>, the multiplexer behaves normally, with FETs N1 and P1 turning on and off in response to A<sub>\_</sub> signals (Figure 1). The parallel

combination of N1 and P1 forms a low-value resistor between NO<sub>\_</sub> and COM<sub>\_</sub> so that signals pass equally well in either direction.

### Positive Fault Condition

When the signal on NO<sub>\_</sub> exceeds V<sub>+</sub> by about 150mV, the positive fault comparator output goes high, turning off FETs N1 and P1 (Figure 1). This makes the NO<sub>\_</sub> pin high impedance, regardless of the switch state. If the switch state is “off,” all FETs turn off, and both NO<sub>\_</sub> and COM<sub>\_</sub> are high impedance. If the switch state is “on,” FET P2 turns on, clamping COM<sub>\_</sub> to V<sub>+</sub>.

### Negative Fault Condition

When the signal on NO<sub>\_</sub> goes about 150mV below V<sub>-</sub>, the negative fault comparator output goes high, turning off FETs N1 and P1 (Figure 1). This makes the NO<sub>\_</sub> pin high impedance, regardless of the switch state. If the switch state is “off,” all FETs turn off, and both NO<sub>\_</sub> and COM<sub>\_</sub> are high impedance. If the switch state is “on,” FET N2 turns on, clamping COM<sub>\_</sub> to V<sub>-</sub>.

### Transient Fault Condition

When a fast rising or falling transient on NO<sub>\_</sub> exceeds V<sub>+</sub> or V<sub>-</sub>, the output (COM<sub>\_</sub>) follows the input (NO<sub>\_</sub>) to the supply rail with only a few nanoseconds delay. This delay is due to the switch on-resistance and circuit capacitance to ground. When the input transient returns to within the supply rails, however, there is a longer output recovery time. For positive faults, the recovery time is typically 2.5μs (see *Typical Operating Characteristics*). For negative faults, the recovery time is typically 1.3μs. These values depend on the COM<sub>\_</sub> output resistance and capacitance. The delays do not depend on the fault amplitude. Higher COM<sub>\_</sub> output resistance and capacitance increase the recovery times.

### COM and A<sub>\_</sub>

FETs N2 and P2 can source about ±10mA from V<sub>+</sub> or V<sub>-</sub> to the COM<sub>\_</sub> pin in the fault condition (Figure 1). Ensure that if the COM<sub>\_</sub> pin is connected to a low-impedance load, the absolute maximum current rating of 30mA is never exceeded, either in normal or fault conditions.

The GND, COM<sub>\_</sub>, and A<sub>\_</sub> pins do not have fault protection. Reverse ESD protection diodes are internally con-

nected between GND, COM<sub>\_</sub>, A<sub>\_</sub>, and both V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub>. If a signal on GND, COM<sub>\_</sub>, or A<sub>\_</sub> exceeds V<sub>+</sub> or V<sub>-</sub> by more than 300mV, one of these diodes will conduct. During normal operation, these reverse-biased ESD diodes leak a few nanoamps of current to V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub>.

### Fault Protection Voltage and Power Off

The maximum fault voltage on the NO<sub>\_</sub> pins is ±40V from ground when the power is off. With ±15V supply voltages, the highest voltage on NO<sub>\_</sub> can be V<sub>+</sub> + 40V, and the lowest voltage on NO<sub>\_</sub> can be V<sub>+</sub> - 40V. Exceeding these limits can damage the chip.

### Logic Level Thresholds

The logic level thresholds are CMOS and TTL compatible with V<sub>+</sub> = 13.5V to V<sub>+</sub> = 16.5V.

## Applications Information

### Ground

There is no connection between the analog signal paths and GND. The analog signal paths consist of an N-channel and a P-channel MOSFET with their sources and drains paralleled and their gates driven out of phase to V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub> by the logic-level translators.

V<sub>+</sub> and GND power the internal logic and logic level translators and set the input logic thresholds. The logic-level translators convert the logic levels to switched V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub> signals to drive the gates of the multiplexers. This drive signal is the only connection between the power supplies and the analog signals. GND, A<sub>\_</sub>, and COM<sub>\_</sub> have ESD protection diodes to V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub>.

### Supply Current Reduction

When the logic signals are driven rail-to-rail from 0 to +15V or -15V to +15V, the current consumption will be reduced from 370μA (typ) to 200μA.

### Power Supplies

The MAX4508/MAX4509 operate with bipolar supplies between ±4.5V and ±20V. The V<sub>+</sub> and V<sub>-</sub> supplies need not be symmetrical, but their sum cannot exceed the 44V absolute maximum rating.

The MAX4508/MAX4509 operate from single supplies between +9V and +36V when V<sub>-</sub> is connected to GND.




Figure 2. Address Transition Time




Figure 3. Enable Switching Time




Figure 4. MAX4508 Break-Before-Make Interval




Figure 5. Charge Injection




Figure 6. Off-Isolation




Figure 7. Crosstalk




Figure 8.  $NO_-$ ,  $COM_-$  Capacitance






Figure 9. Transient Behavior of Fault Condition
